Matusadona Traverse with 16 Degrees South

Matusadona National Park in Northern Zimbabwe is situated along the southern shoreline of Lake Kariba between the Sanyati and Ume Rivers. It's made up of over 1,500 square kilometres of rugged mountains, sprawling flood plains, narrow inlets and secluded bays which provide the perfect setting for a truly extra ordinary expeditionary safari experience.

Our mobile safari traverses the entire National Park, from the bays and inlets of the Ume River to the towering cliffs of the Sanyati Gorge and the diverse scenery in between.

Over the course of 5 days, you will traverse this stunning national park on foot, navigating the towering escarpment along centuries old elephant paths and game trails. Led by experienced guides, this expedition is participatory in nature with guests carrying their own backpacks, tents, sleeping bag and inflatable mattresses.

This is an adventure into one of Zimbabwe's most remote and little visited destinations where you are immersed in a true wilderness adventure.

Points of Interest: Sanyati Gorge, Ume River, Matusadona Escarpment, springs, Rupert Fothergill's plaque, big 4 wildlife viewing and scenic Lake Kariba.



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Expedition Hike – 7 Nights Matusadona National Park

(Seasonally Available: June - July)

- 4 Nights fly camping – Sanyati Gorge to Ume River
- 3 x Nights luxury safari lodge at start and end of the hike
- 15 -18km distance per day – mountainous terrain
- Minimum 4 Pax, Maximum 8 pax
- Participatory in nature – guests are expected to get “stuck in” to a degree!
- Guests must be active and able to walk comfortably for fair distances per day.
